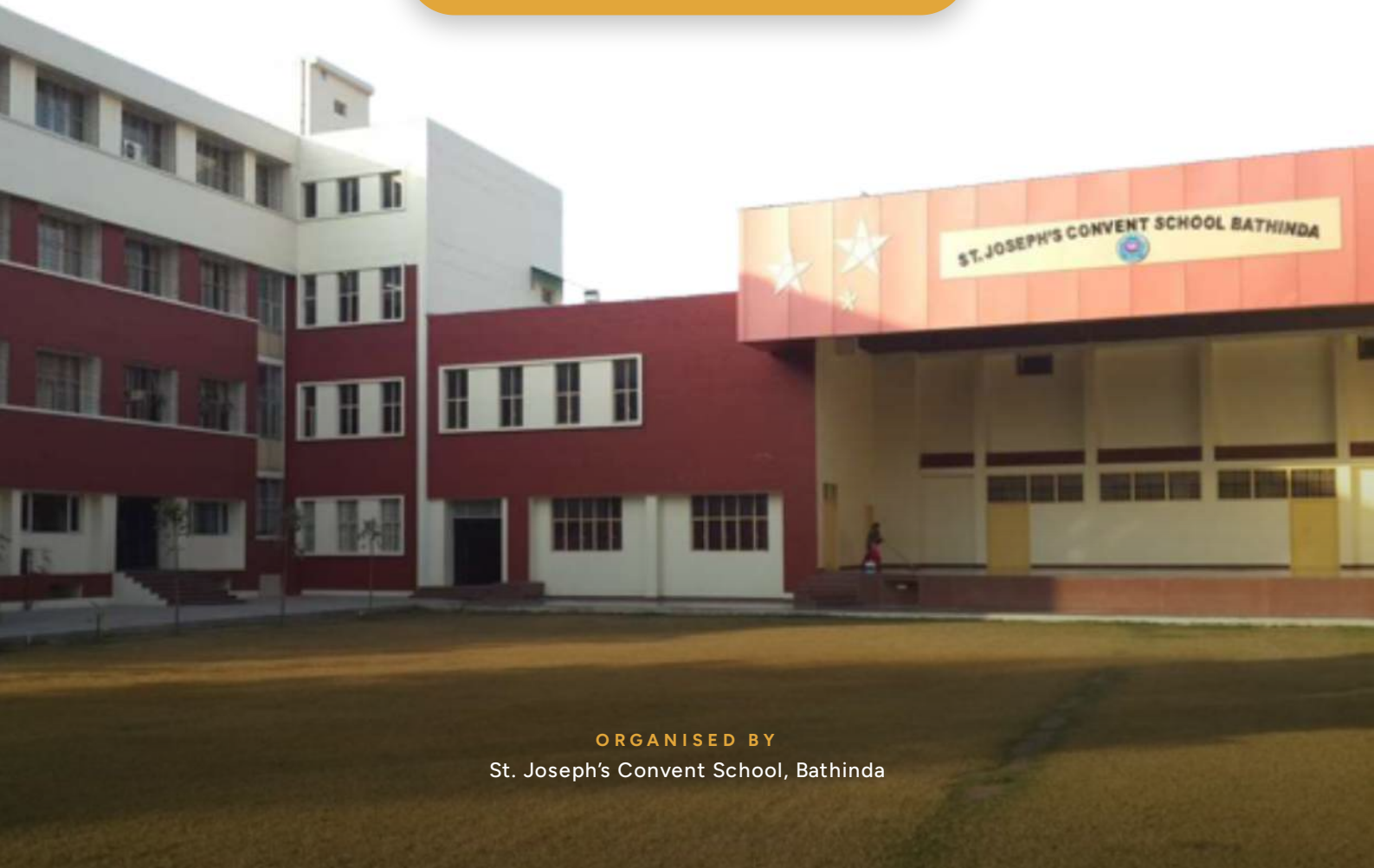

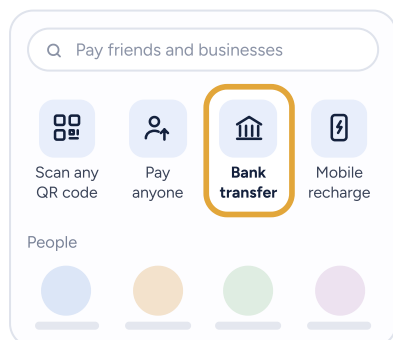

Type the **account number** and the **IFSC code** from section 2. Re-check both digit by digit.

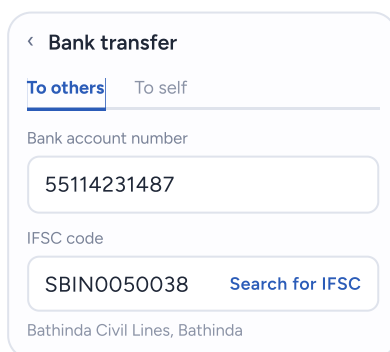

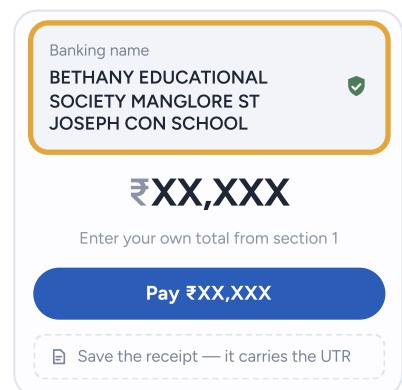
